# Tirana, 8 July 2019

Representatives from the Agency for the Support of Civil Society (ASCS) took part in the opening ceremony of the PRO PAK Service Centre, organized by the "Down Syndrome Albania" (DSA).



100 children with disabilities and their families in Albania will benefit from the services at newly opened PRO PAK Service Centre managed by Down Syndrome Albania. All people with disabilities have the right to access all public services, contribute to the community and live valued lives.









### Main services of this centre:

- 1. Assessments by the multidisciplinary team
- 2. Physical therapy, psychomotricity and hydrotherapy
- 3. Language and Speech Therapy
- 4. Developmental and occupational therapy
- 5. Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Therapy
- 6. Therapy with the Floortime method
- 7. Art Therapy and Music Therapy
- 8. Group therapy
- 9. Service of early therapeutic intervention in the natural environment of the family
- 10. Kindergarten / school support service
- 11. Language and mathematics course
- 12. The dance course
- 13. Personal Autonomy Course for Children 3-13 years old
- 14. Social autonomy course for adolescents and adults
- 15. Individual psychological counseling with parents
- 16. Group therapy with parents
- 17. Legal assistance





# Hospices of Hope officially launched its projects in Albania

Tirana, 9 July 2019



Representatives from the Agency for the Support of Civil Society took part in the Garden Reception on the occasion of the official launch of Hospices of Hope projects in Albania, which was held at Grand Hotel & Spa Tirana.

The event was attended by the British Ambassador to Albania; diplomats from various international missions as well as members of the local and international business environment; the representatives of country partners Ryder Albania and ABC Health Center were also present.

Hospices of Hope is an international charity organization founded in the United Kingdom that dedicated almost the last three decades to the development of palliative care services in South-Eastern Europe. Palliative care is an approach that improves the quality of life of patients and their families facing the problem associated with life-threatening illness, through the prevention and relief of suffering by means of early identification and impeccable assessment and treatment of pain and other problems, physical, psycho-social and spiritual.









Hospices of Hope's mission in Albania is to contribute to the development of palliative care within the country and to increase access to this type of services for those in need. In order to fulfill its mission Hospices of Hope has partnered with local organizations and is actively implementing the following four projects: Two mobile multidisciplinary teams in Tirana and Durres with Ryder Albania; One Palliative Day Care Centre developed with ABC Health Centre in Tirana and A remote mobile palliative care team integrated into the municipal hospital of Kukes.

The project covers the costs of care, salaries, administrative costs including transportation, palliative care trainings as well as the development of an online application for the providers of services. All services offered within the Hospices of Hope Network are free of charge for the beneficiaries.

Hospices of Hope Albania's projects are implemented with the financial support of Medicor Foundation and Bristol-Myers Squibb Foundation.





ASCS Announces Final Nominees List of Qualified Candidates to be elected as new civil society members on NCCS


Tirana, 23 July 2019






**ONLINE VOTING for the Election of NCCS Members**
